## Mobile Manners

Tips for teens and adults . . .

1. **The person in front of you takes precedence over the person on the phone.**

That means if you are standing in line at a store and you are taking a call, you should end the call when you get to the register.

2. **Eye contact is necessary when speaking to someone.**

If you, or someone else, is talking to you it is considered rude to not make eye contact. Give the person in front of you attention.

3. **No one wants to hear your gossip or relationship issues in public.**

Keep private matters private. No one should be standing in line next to you and hear your conversation. Keep your personal conversations personal and don't have them in public places.

4. **Your phone should be on silent or vibrate when in public places.**

Go to the movies, library, or church with your volume off so as to not disturb others.



2. **Stay informed.** Keeping in touch with teachers can encourage your scholars to do well in class. Find out how you can check on your child's assignments and grades (in PowerSchool). Ask for the best way to contact each teacher (e-mail, phone, etc.).

3. **Limit technology.** Homework will be easier if your child isn't tempted by the TV, the Internet, or video games. Decide how much screen time he's allowed so it won't interfere with learning. Example: one hour on school nights and two hours a day on weekends.
